



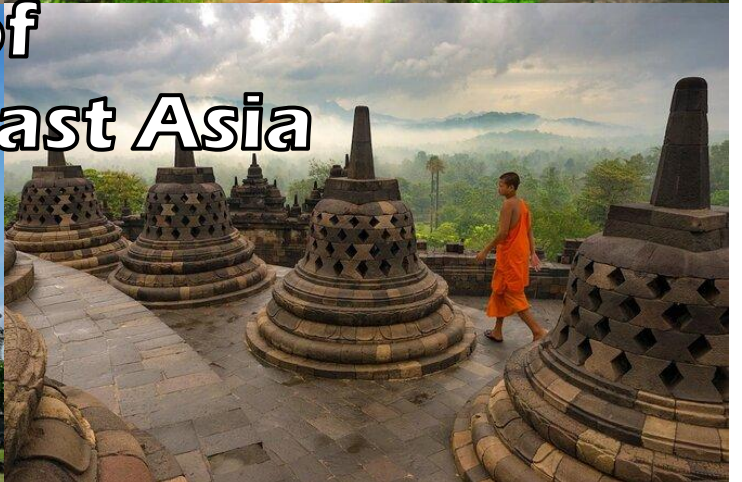

21 APR | SUN: SINGAPORE - SIAM REAP - ANGKOR THOM - BAYON - TA PROM - ANGKOR WAT (D)

Depart from Singapore Changi Airport Terminal 2 to Siem Reap by Singapore Airlines flight SQ 164 at 0845 Hrs, arrive at New Siem Reap International Airport at 0950 Hrs, on arrival clear immigration and collect your bags and clear customs, meet our chauffeur at arrival hall, transfer to the Hotel, drive to Angkor Complex: Angkor Wat Temple The UNESCO Listed, **Angkor Thom**, the fortified city of Angkor Thom covers an area of 10 square km. Enter by the monumental South Gate over a causeway lined on either side by statues of demons and gods, each carrying a giant naga. We will stop at the famous **Bayon temple** and continue to the Terrace of the Elephants and the terrace of the Leper Kings, then to Ta Phrom - It has been controversially left to the destructive power of the jungle by French archaeologists to demonstrate the awesome power of nature, Later visit Satcha Cambodia Handicrafts Incubation Center. To create the first Cambodian handicraft center that incubates local artisans, mixing traditional knowledge with contemporary design to showcase Cambodian" talents to local and international visitors and to transmit this know-how over time while having a sustainable social, economic, and environmental impact. Then enjoy Dinner with Cambodian traditional Apsara dance show (International Vegetarian Buffet), **overnight stay in Siem Reap.**

Angkor Wat Temples, Angkor Wat in Siem Reap, Cambodia is the largest religious monument in the world. Angkor Wat, translated from Khmer (the official language of Cambodia) literally means "City Temple." As far as names go this is as generic as it gets. Angkor Wat was not the original name given to the temple when it was built in the 12th century. We have little knowledge of how this temple was referred to during the time of its use, as there are no extant texts or inscriptions that mention the temple by name—this is quite incredible if we consider the fact that Angkor Wat is the greatest religious construction project in Southeast Asia. A possible reason why the temple's original name may have never been documented is that it was such an important and famous monument that there was no need to refer to it by its name. We have several references to the king who built the temple, King Suryavarman II (1113-1145/50 C.E.), and events that took place at the temple, but no mention of its name. Angkor Wat is dedicated to the Hindu god Vishnu who is one of the three principal gods in the Hindu pantheon (Shiva and Brahma are the others). Among them he is known as the "Protector." The major patron of Angkor Wat was King Suryavarman II, whose name translates as the "protector of the sun".

Bayon Temple, At the heart of Angkor Thom is the 12th-century Bayon, the mesmerising, if slightly mind-bending, state temple of Jayavarman VII. It epitomises the creative genius and inflated ego of Cambodia's most celebrated king. Its 54 Gothic towers are decorated with 216 gargantuan smiling faces of Avalokiteshvara, and it is adorned with 1.2km of extraordinary bas-reliefs incorporating more than 11,000 figures.

Ta Prohm, is up there with Angkor Wat and Bayon temple as one of the most visited temples in the Angkor Park. There are many reasons for its popularity, but the biggest reason is probably that it was used as the backdrop for the filming of the Lara Croft Movie - Tomb Raider. The jungle is literally growing through the middle of the temple which also adds intrigue and wonder to this amazing site.

Satcha Cambodian Handicraft Incubation Centre - Satcha is located near Build Bright University or about 5 minutes drive from Pub Street. This handicraft incubation center welcomes national and international tourists for free every day from 8am to 7pm. There are 6 workshops built exclusively with Cambodian bamboo from traditional know-how with contemporary design inspired by Khmer ornaments host around 50 artisans and 15 different know-how: carving (stone, wood, bamboo, leather) weaving (rattan, sea grass, water hyacinth, silk, cotton) painting and lacquer, jewelry, and silver plating. You can also visit the concept store and try refreshing drinks at the coffee shop.

Apsara Dance Show with Dinner, Feast on a buffet dinner of International vegetarian cuisine and take in an Apsara dance performance featuring the traditional culture of Cambodia. Watch several dances including classical and folk styles on stage. Enjoy a variety of dishes while you are served by an attentive staff and entertained with a breathtaking evening.

22 APR | MON: SIEM REAP - PHNOM KULEN WATERFALL - BANTEAY SREI (B/D)

Early morning leave for sunrise and back to hotel. Finish breakfast at the Hotel; Today, a 50 km drive northeast of Siem Reap will take us to **Phnom Kulen Mountains** where you will be passing a landscape of tropical forest and rural communities in your air-conditioned vehicle. The first stop of the day is a hilltop temple, where you'll find a massive reclining Buddha carved directly into a sandstone boulder. Next, head to the Thousand Lingas River and exploring a riverbank adorned with ancient carvings of Hindu gods. Cool off at another sacred site, **Phnom Kulen Waterfalls**, which tumble into a wide basin that's ideal for a midday swim. Then visit to BanteaySrei is considered to be the jewel of classical Khmer art. This temple is often a favorite with visitors, back to the Hotel and overnight stay in Siem Reap.

Phnom Kulen Mountains, One of the most popular attractions in Cambodia is the majestic Phnom Kulenmountain, located about 1.5-2 hours away from Siem Reap. The mountain was given its name due to the abundance of lychee trees it once hosted, and nowadays offers visitors a beautiful view, as well as fun activities such as picnicking and waterfall swimming. Located about 50 kilometers from the city of Siem Reap, Phnom Kulen is one of Cambodia's most revered sites. According to legend, it was here that King Jayavarman II declared independence from Java in 802 CE and thus began the Khmer Empire - as an independent nation.

Additionally, it's a very sacred site with multiple temples easily accessible. Two sites most noted are the Thousand Lingas at Kbal Spean, within the Kulen National Park site and PreahAng Thom pagoda with its giant reclining Buddha. The area is a magnet to "krukmer" (natural medicine doctors), and attracts people seeking blessings from its holy waters, particularly the potent life-giving waters at Kbal Spean, that are said to help couples conceive.

Phnom Kulen Waterfall, Considered by Khmers to be the most sacred mountain in Cambodia, Phnom Kulen is a popular place of pilgrimage on weekends and during festivals. It played a significant role in the history of the Khmer empire, as it was from here in 802 CE that Jayavarman II proclaimed himself a devaraja (god-king), giving birth to the Cambodian kingdom. Attractions include a giant reclining Buddha, hundreds of lingas carved in the riverbed, an impressive waterfall and some remote temples.

Banteay Srei, Considered by many to be the jewel in the crown of Angkorian art, BanteaySrei is cut from stone of a pinkish hue and includes some of the finest stone carving anywhere on earth. Begun in 967 CE, it is one of the smallest sites at Angkor, but what it lacks in size it makes up for in stature. The art gallery of Angkor, this Hindu temple dedicated to Shiva is wonderfully well preserved, and many of its carvings are three-dimensional.

23 APR | TUE: SIEM REAP - PREAH VIHEAR TEMPLE - KOH KER (B/D)

Breakfast at the Hotel; Also add Proceed for full day tour to visit **Prasat Preah Vihear** is a World Heritage Site by UNESCO. Superb temple-mountain dedicated to the Hindu god Shiva. It stretches for 800 m and is composed of a series of sanctuaries, linked by long galleries. Perched at 625 m, on the edge of the Thai border, it offers a spectacular view of the Cambodian plain. Get down for this mountain temple and then drive to Koh Ker temple, the former capital of the Khmer Empire between 928 and 944 A.D. The style of the **Koh Ker temple** is different from any other temple in Cambodia and has more of a resemblance to the ancient pyramids of Egypt. Partially overgrown by the forest and inhabited only by birds, this temple and its surroundings are an exceptional experience.

PreahVihear Temple, Situated on the edge of a plateau that dominates the plain of Cambodia, the Temple of PreahVihear is dedicated to Shiva. The Temple is composed of a series of sanctuaries linked by a system of pavements and staircases over an 800 metre long axis and dates back to the first half of the 11th century AD. Nevertheless, its complex history can be traced to the 9th century, when the hermitage was founded. This site is particularly well preserved, mainly due to its remote location. The site is exceptional for the quality of its architecture, which is adapted to the natural environment and the religious function of the temple, as well as for the exceptional quality of its carved stone ornamentation.

24 APR | WED: SIEM REAP - DA NANG (B/D)

Morning breakfast at hotel, Morning check-out from the Hotel and your driver will pick up and transfer to Airport for departure. **Board Cambodia Angkor Air flight K6 840 for Da Nang at 1455 Hrs. Arrive Da Nang International Airport at 1650 Hrs**, clear immigration and collect baggage. Meet your Guide and transfer to hotel and check in, Dinner at local restaurant and overnight stay in Da Nang.

25 APR | THU: DA NANG - MARBLE MOUNTAIN - HOI AN - DA NANG (B/D)

Breakfast at hotel, transfer to visit Marble Mountain (One-way elevator), where you will be rewarded by great city views and amazed by the main cave which houses a beautiful Cham Buddha sitting under a natural shaft of light. They are 5 stone hillocks rising sharply from the surrounding rice fields and said to each represent one of the five elements of the universe.

Then visit Son Tra Peninsula and Linh Ung Pagoda, where the highest Goddess of Mercy Statue of Vietnam is located. The pagoda offers stunning views of Da Nang beach and Cham Islands in the distance then proceed to Hoi An ancient town: walking to visit a traditional Chinese Communal House, Hoi Kien Temple, ancient Tan Ky Merchants' Houses, the 400-year-old Japanese Covered Bridge & spending time in Colorful Hoi An Local Market. Then back to Da Nang, Overnight stay in Da Nang.

Marble Mountain, Discover the tunnels and grottoes within Thuy Son, the only one of the five Marble Mountains that's open to travelers. Marvel at the Buddhist temples carved into the rock, then head to the hilltop overlook for awe-inspiring views of the city. Join a guided tour to learn more about the history of the mountains.

Son Tra Peninsula and Linh Ung Pagoda, Going to the beach and enjoying the bright sunshine, the lovely sandbank as well as the extremely clean and refreshing sea water has always been a must when you visit Da Nang city. However, if you plan to stay here for a bit long and have got bored of the beach, then you may want to visit other parts of the city, If you are a person of religion, or simply someone who's looking for a quiet and tranquil place, then Linh Ung Pagoda (Bai But).

Hoi An, One of the oldest cities in Asia, Hoi An is a town in central Vietnam which was declared as a World Heritage Site by UNESCO in 1999. Located south of Danang, Hoi An translates to 'a peaceful meeting place'. It is culturally and historically one of Vietnam's most important towns and also one of the richest. It is important to note that Hoi An does not have an airport or train station and can only be reached by road. Stepping into Hoi An feels like entering a living museum where ancient architecture, centuries-old traditions, and a tranquil riverside setting coalesce harmoniously. The city's well-preserved Old Town, adorned with charming yellow-walled buildings, lantern-lit streets, and historic merchant houses, narrates a story of its illustrious past as a bustling trading port. Beyond its architectural splendors, Hoi An enchants visitors with its vibrant markets, where artisans showcase their crafts. The food of Hoi An is delightfully interesting and multi-cultural. The regional cuisine is served traditionally but also can be found to be served under the influence of Eastern Asia and other parts of South-Eastern Asia. As dusk descends, the city transforms into a mesmerizing spectacle as thousands of colorful lanterns illuminate the streets and waterways, creating a captivating ambiance during the enchanting lantern festival.

26 APR | FRI: DA NANG - MY SON - DA NANG (B/D)

Morning breakfast at Hotel, This morning we depart to My Son Sanctuary (Approx. 1hrs drive), a cluster of abandoned and partially ruined Hindu Temples in Vietnam, constructed between the 4th and the 14th century by the kings of Champa. It was noted in 1999 as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, Back to Da Nang. Visit Pink Church, it was the only church built in Da Nang city in the French colonial period in 1923, Photo stop at Dragon Bridge, the longest iconic bridge in Vietnam; Love Bridge. Shopping at Han Market to pursue independent activities and shopping opportunities, Overnight stay in Da Nang.

During the 4th to 13th centuries there was a unique culture on the coast of contemporary Vietnam, owing its spiritual origins to the Hinduism of India. This is graphically illustrated by the remains of a series of impressive tower temples in a dramatic site that was the religious and political capital of the Champa Kingdom for most of

its existence. My Son Sanctuary dates from the 4th to the 13th centuries CE. The property is located in the mountainous border Duy Xuyen District of Quang Nam Province, in central Viet Nam. It is situated within an elevated geological basin surrounded by a ring of mountains, which provides the watershed for the sacred Thu Bon river. The source of the Thu Bon river is here and it flows past the monuments, out of the basin, and through the historic heartland of the Champa Kingdom, draining into the South China Sea at its mouth near the ancient port city of Hoi An. The location gives the sites its strategic significance as it is also easily defensible.

The Hindu tower temples of the My Son Sanctuary are located within a well-protected property with clearly defined boundaries. Eight groups of 71 standing monuments exist as well as extensive buried archaeology representing the complete historic sequence of construction of tower temples at the site, covering the entire period of the existence of the Champa Kingdom.

27 APR | SAT: DA NANG - HO CHI MINH CITY (B/D)

Breakfast at Hotel, after breakfast check out and then transfer to the airport for flight to Saigon, Board VietJet Air flight VJ 625 for Saigon at 1030 Hrs. Arrive Tan Son Nhat International Airport at 1155 Hrs, meet and greet by local tour guide & transfer to have lunch at restaurant. In the afternoon you will visit three popular Hindu Temple in Saigon: **Mariamman Temple; Sri Thendayuthapani Temple; Subramania Swamy Temple**. Dinner at local restaurant, **Overnight stay in Saigon.**

Mariamman Hindu Temple, *Mariamman Temple is one of the most magnificent places in Ho Chi Minh City due to its distinctive Hindu architecture and untold story about Mariamman contributing to bringing happiness and wealth to the community*

Sri Thendayuthapani Temple, *A temple located in the urban area, the green walls of the temple are very conspicuous. The sculptures inside are very delicate and beautiful. The surrounding environment is also very good. Many people come here to worship.*

Subramania Swamy Temple, *Centrally located in the bustling city of Saigon, this colorful temple was built by Indian merchants in the 19th century. The striking feature of Subramaniam temple is the vivid images of navagrahas wearing colored silk robes.*

28 APR | SUN: HO CHI MINH CITY - DENPASAR BALI (B/D)

Early Breakfast at the Hotel, check out from the Hotel and transfer to Tan Son Nhat International Airport, Ho Chi Minh City to take VietJet Air flight VJ 897 for Denpasar Bali at 1150 Hrs, Arrive t I Gusti Ngurah Rai Airport at 1640 Hrs. Upon arrival clear immigration and collect baggage. Pick up and transfer to Being Sattva, Ubud Bali. Experience Dance performance at Ubud. Later transfer to Being Sattva. Check in, Dinner and **Overnight stay at Being Sattva.**

Island of Bali - Today it is the only remaining stronghold of Hinduism in the archipelago, and Balinese life is centred on religion—a blend of Hinduism (especially that of the Shaivite sect), Buddhism, Malay ancestor cult, and animistic and magical beliefs and practices. 01 MAY | WED: DENPASAR BALI - YOGYAKARTA (B/D)

Morning breakfast at hotel, check-out from the resort and transfer to Denpasar I Gusti Ngurah Rai Intl. 02 MAY | THU: BOROBUDUR - SAMBISARI TEMPLE - PRAMBANAN & SEWU TEMPLE - IJO TEMPLE (B/D)

Morning breakfast at Hotel, Transfer to Magelang to visit Borobudur a UNESCO World Heritage site, Continue to visit Mendhut the Monastery temple. Drive back to Yogyakarta, visit to Sambisari Temple, the one of the Hindu temple in Yogyakarta that is unique temple and really special because it is located under the ground

Visit to Prambanan Temple - the biggest Hindu's temple complex and Sewu temple .Enjoy sunset at Ijo temple (based on weather) - this is the highest Hindu's temple in Yogyakarta. Dinner at Indian restaurant (vegetarian meals)

Evening free at leisure or shopping at Malioboro Street and then back to hotel, **Overnight stay in Yogyakarta**

Borobudur, it is the world's largest Buddhist monument and the largest human-made structure in the southern hemisphere. It predates Angkor Wat by 300 years and Notre Dame by 200 years. Rediscovered in 1815, it has been excavated and returned to its original glory. The stone relief panels offer a clear glimpse into Buddhist doctrine and Javanese life 1,000 years ago. You will have plenty of time to amble about this fabulous monument.

Mendut Temple, This exquisite temple, around 3.5km east of Borobudur, may look insignificant compared with its mighty neighbour, but it houses the most outstanding statue in its original setting of any temple in Java. The magnificent 3m-high figure of the Buddha is flanked by Bodhisattvas: Lokeshvara on the left and Vairapana on the right. The Buddha is also notable for his posture: he sits Western-style with both feet on the ground. Admission includes entry to Candi Pawon, a Buddhist temple, 2km west.

Prambanan Temple, Built in the 10th century, this is the largest temple compound dedicated to Shiva in Indonesia. Rising above the centre of the last of these concentric squares are three temples decorated with reliefs illustrating the epic of the Ramayana, dedicated to the three great Hindu divinities (Shiva, Vishnu and Brahma) and three temples dedicated to the animals who serve them.

Candi Sambisari, This Shiva temple, possibly the latest temple at Prambanan to be erected by the Mataram dynasty, was discovered by a farmer in 1966. Excavated from under ancient layers of protective volcanic ash and dust, it lies almost 6m below the level of the surrounding fields and is remarkable for its perfectly preserved condition. The inner sanctum of the temple is dominated by a large lingam and yoni (stylised penis and vagina), typical of Shiva temples.

Ijo Temple Sunset, also known as The Sunset Temple, is a temple with highest location in Yogyakarta, for a sunset view. It's located from RatuBoko temple location. The temple compound is located in Groyokan hamlet, Sambirejo village, Kecamatan Prambanan, Sleman Regency, Yogyakarta. The temple's name derived from its location, the Gumukljo hill. The temple compound stood on western slope of the hill, in a quiet region east of Yogyakarta, around 4 kilometers southeast from RatuBoko archaeological compound. The temple elevation is 410 meters above the sea level. The western hill of Gumukljo provides beautiful scenery overlooking rice paddies, villages and Adisucipto International Airport.

03 MAY | FRI: MUSEUM KERIS - CETHO - SUKUH TEMPLE (B/D)

Breakfast at hotel, Drive to Solo Town (it needs around 1.5 hours one way). Visit to Keris Museum which collect more than 400 Keris with varieties model. Transfer to Karanganyar and have lunch at local restaurant with Vegetarian menu. Visit to Cetho Temple - the Hindu's Temple has 13 leveling terraces depict the human's journey from sinful creatures to the holy ones (moksa). Continue to Sukuh Temple, a Hindu temple which built in 15th century. Have dinner at local restaurant, Back to Yogyakarta. Free program. **Overnight stay in Yogyakarta.**

Museum Keris, A new museum in Surakarta, Central Java, aims to reconnect contemporary Indonesians with the original values and philosophy of the keris (kris), an ancient serpentine weapon often associated with the mystical realm.

CandiSukuh, In a magnificent position 900m above the Solo plain with fine views of GunungLawu, CandiSukuh is one of Java's most enigmatic and striking temples. It's not a large site, but it's beautifully proportioned with a truncated pyramid of rough-hewn stone. Fascinating reliefs and Barong statues decorate the facade. It's clear that a fertility cult was practised here: several explicit carvings have led to Sukuh being dubbed the 'erotic' temple. It's a quiet, isolated place with a potent atmosphere.

Cetho Temples, (Indonesian: CandiCeto) is a fifteenth-century Javanese-Hindu temple that is located on the western slope of Mount Lawu (elev. 1495 m above sea level)] on the border between Central and East Java provinces.

Cetho is one of several temples built on the northwest slopes of Mount Lawu in the fifteenth century. By this time, Javanese religion and art had diverged from Indian precepts that had been so influential on temples styles during the 8-10th century. This area was the last significant area of temple building in Java before the island's courts were converted to Islam in the 16th century. The temples' distinctiveness and the lack of records of Javanese ceremonies and beliefs of the era make it difficult for historians to interpret the significance of these antiquities
