



14 DAYS & 13 NIGHTS EXPLORE THE TEMPLES OF SOUTH

09 JUL I SUN:

SINGAPORE - KOCHI

Depart from Singapore Changi Airport T3 to Kochi by Singapore Airlines flight SQ 536 at 2225 Hrs and arrive at Cochin International Airport at 0020 Hrs, upon arrival clear immigration, customs and you will be greeted by our tour guide and transfer to the Hotel for check-in and overnight at the hotel in Kochi Airport.

10 JUL I MON:

KOCHI - GURUVAYUR - COIMBATORE

Breakfast at the Hotel; Morning check-out from the Hotel and start at 0930 Hrs to Guruvayur (80 Km's & 2 Hrs Approx.), arrive at Guruvayur and visit to Guruvayurappan Temple for Uchi Pooja (1130 AM - 1230 PM), after visiting temple, proceed to Coimbatore (145 Km's & 3.5 Hrs approx.), arrive at Coimbatore, check-in to the Hotel, Dinner and overnight stay at Coimbatore.

Guruvayur is home to the historic Sree Krishna Temple, called the Dwaraka of the South. It is among the most revered and popular pilgrimage destinations in Kerala and the entire country. The central shrine is believed to have been rebuilt in 1638 C.E. The architectural style and individual elements inside the shrine are beautiful representations of the history of the place.

As per tradition, the shrine faces the East with two Gopurams (tower), one in the East (Kizhakkenada) and other in the West (Padinjarenada). In the front and the east side of the Nalambalam (a square shaped column) lie the pillars of light called Deepastambam. There are a number of such light pillars in the temple. The eastern side's Deepastambam is 24 feet in height and has thirteen circular receptacles, making it an absolutely spectacular sight when lit. Another famous sight here is the Dwajasthamba. It is a flag-staff, around 70 feet tall, fully covered with gold.

11 JUL I TUE:

COIMBATORE

(B/D)

Morning breakfast at the hotel; Morning you will travel to Marudhamalai to visit Marudhamalai Murugan Temple. This temple is dedicated to Lord Murugan and is considered his seventh house. Like most Murugan Temples this temple is also situated on a hill, late back to the Hotel and rest / shopping in Coimbatore City's famous shopping streets Crosscut Road. Evening around 4 PM, visit to Perur to visit a very famous Lord Shiva Temple, Arulmigu Patteeswarar Swamy Temple, while visiting the temple do check out the intricate carvings on the pillars. The temple is famous for its gopurams (domes) and pillars. After you have paid your respects to Lord Pateeshwarar Swamy and later proceed to visit Isha Yoga Center.

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On your way you will find yourself surrounded by beautiful farmlands. Isha Yoga center is located at the foothills of Velliangiri. Its unique energy, structure and location make it a tremendously powerful place for self-transformation. The majestic 112 ft Adiyogi statue will sweep you off your feet. We also suggest you meditate for a while in the Dhyanalinga Dome. After your peaceful experience at the Isha Yoga center, travel back to the hotel and relax for some time. Rest of the day you are free to do what you want or we can **take you shopping** to the famous cross-cut road, Overnight stay at the hotel in Coimbatore.

12 JUL I WED: COIMBATORE - PALANI - MADURAI

Morning breakfast at the hotel; Post breakfast, check-out from the hotel and travel to Palani (110 Km's). In Palani, Visit Palani Murugan Temple, This Temple is dedicated to Lord Muruga and is located on a hill overlooking the town. To reach the top there are few options, using the 693 steps to the top-which a normal person will take 20-30 min's to reach the top. For the convenience of tourists and pilgrims the temple also has winch cars and cable cars to reach the temple, later proceed from Palani to Madurai (100 Km's & 2.5 Hrs approx.), evening arrive at Madurai, check-in to the Hotel and overnight stay at the hotel in Madurai.

Palani Arulmigu Shri Dhandayuthapani temple is one of the Six Abodes of Murugan. It is located in the town of Palani in Dindigul district, 100 kilometers (62 mi) southeast of Coimbatore and northwest of Madurai in the foot-hills of the Palani hills, Tamil Nadu, India. Palani temple is considered synonymous with Panchamirtam, a sweet mixture made of five ingredients.

As per Hindu legendary beliefs, Sage Narada visited the celestial court of Shiva at Mount Kailash to present to him a fruit, the gnana-palam (literally, the fruit of knowledge). He decided to award it to whichever of his two sons who first encircle the world thrice. Accepting the challenge, Murugan started his journey around the globe on his mount peacock. However, Ganesha, who surmised that the world was no more than his parents Shiva and Shakti combined, circumambulated them and won the fruit. Murugan was furious and felt the need to get matured from boyhood and hence chose to remain as a hermit in Palani. The idol of the Muruga in Palani was created and consecrated by sage Bogar, one of Hinduism's eighteen great siddhas, out of an amalgam of nine poisons or navapashanam.

MADURAI

Early morning visit to **Madurai Meenakshi Amman Temple**, back to the Hotel for Breakfast, after breakfast, proceed to visit **Pazhamudhircholai Murugan Temple & Azhagar Kovil**, by noon back to the Hotel and afternoon free at leisure / shopping, evening visit to Thiruparankundram Murugan Temple, back to the Hote, Dinner and overnight stay at the Hotel in Madurai.

Meenakshi Amman Temple, also known as Meenakshi-Sundareshwara Temple, is one of the oldest and most important temples in India. Located in the city of Madurai, the temple has a great mythological and historical significance. It is believed that Lord Shiva assumed the form of Sundareswarar (the handsome one) and married Parvati (Meenakshi) at the site where the temple is currently located. Renowned for its astonishing architecture, Meenakshi Temple was nominated as one of the wonders of the world, but couldn't make it into the list of 'Seven Wonders of the World'. However, the temple is definitely one of the 'Wonders of India'. It is also one of the main attractions of South India with thousands of devotees thronging it every day

Pazhamudhircholai is one among the 6 prominent abodes of Lord Muruga, called as Arupadaiveedu. Others important abodes of Lord Muruga are Thiruparankundram Subramanya Swamy Temple, Palani Dandayudhapani Swami Temple, Swamimalai Swaminatha Swami Temple, Tiruchendur Senthil Andavar Temple and Tiruttani Subramanya Swamy Temple. On the top of a hill with forests around, it is quite close to the temple of Lord Vishnu Azhagar Kovil.

One of the prominent religious shrines, **Thiruparankundram Murugan Temple** is among the 6 temples of Lord Murugan, called as Arupadaiveedu. This temple has been carved out of a mountain by cutting rocks adding on to its overall magnetism. Thiruparankundram Temple was built in the 8th century during the Pandyan reign. This temple, with its shrine carved out of a rock, has separate shrines for Lord Shiva, Lord Vishnu, Goddess Durga, Lord Vinayaka and of other prominent Hindu deities. This temple, which is also historically important, is known for a special feature. In this temple, idols of Lord Shiva and Lord Vishnu face each other, which is a unique aspect in a Hindu temple. From this temple, sun and moon can be seen together, which is a major attraction among devotees.

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14 JUL I FRI:

MADURAI - PILLAYARPATTI - KARAIKUDI

Morning breakfast at the hotel; check-out and proceed to Pillayarpatti to visit Karpaga Vinayagar Temple, later proceed to Karaikudi (The Land of Chettinad), Karaikudi is situated in the Sivaganaga district of Tamil Nadu. This town flaunts of a wide range of traditional Chettinad. Though it was popular and powerful in its heydays, Karaikudi is the heritage hub of South India, check-in to the Hotel, Dinner and overnight stay at the Hotel in Karaikudi.

Karpaga Vinayagar Temple is one of the oldest Cave Temples (Rock Cut) of Tamilnadu and situated at Pillayarpatti, Which is between Pudukkottai and Karaikudi. Pillayarpatti is situated at a distance of 71kms from Madurai and 12 kms from Karaikudi on Thirupathur - Karaikudi State Highway. The village gets its name from the temple. Here Lord Vinayaga appears with 2 hands unlike in other places where he is seen with 4 hands. The six feet presiding deity is called as Karpaga Vinayagar [valampuri posture]. Over 15 inscriptions are found within the temple, that help establish the age of the temple. Vinayagar Chathurthi festival during August-September is the main festival of the temple. It is celebrated for 10 days in a grand manner. Sankata Hara Chathurthy every month is also celebrated with a festival look. Unlike other places the three Lingams Thiruveesar, Marudhesar and Senchadeswarar and the three Goddess Sivagami amman, Vadamalar Mangaiamman and Soundara Nayagiamman all appear together at the same place and bless the devotees.

15 JUL I SAT:

KARAIKUDI - PUDUKOTTAI - TRICHY

Morning breakfast at the hotel; check-out from the Hotel and proceed to Tiruchirapalli, en route visit to **Pudukottai Bhuvaneshwari Temple**, afternoon arrive at Trichy, check-in to the Hotel and evening visit to **Sri Rangam - Shri Ranganathaswamy Temple**, evening back to the Hotel, Dinner and overnight stay at the Hotel in Trichy

This is one of the most popular temples in the town of Pudukkottai, despite its recent history - the temple was established only as recently as in 1962. However, the deity here is regarded as being extremely powerful, which explains the ceaseless throng of visitors to this temple. Sakti - the primordial energy - is known by various names, including Parasakti, Raja Rajeswari, etc. Each of these has different aspects, one of which is Bhuvaneswari, meaning the ruler of the worlds. The grand façade outside leads to a rather simple one-shrine garbhagriham inside, with a beautiful vigraham of Bhuvaneswari Amman, depicted with four arms - the front two hands in abhaya hastam and varada hastam, and the rear hands holding the pasam and ankusam. A Srichakra Maha Meru is installed in front of the shrine.

The abode of a deity often described as Nam Perumal and Azahagiya Manavaalan, Tamil for "our god" and "beautiful groom", the magnificent Ranganathaswamy Temple is home to Lord Ranganatha, a form of Lord Vishnu in a reclining pose. Considered as one of the eight sywayambu kshetras of Lord Vishnu as per Alwar - the tradition of Tamil Nadu's poet saints - its glory has seen it become the only temple to have been praised by all of them in their hymns. Together, they created as many as 247 pasurams or hymns in praise of the temple and its presiding deity. Often referred to as the world's largest functioning Hindu temple spread over a155 acres complex, it is also home to the tallest gopuram or temple tower across all South India. In fact, its rajagopuram makes for architectural grandeur at 237 feet above the complex base, moving up in 11 ascending tiers.

16 JUL I SUN:

TRICHY - THANJAVUR - KUMBAKONAM

Early morning visit to Ucchi Pillayar Temple in Trichy, Morning breakfast at the hotel; after breakfast, rest for some time and by noon check-out from the hotel and proceed to Kumbakonam, en route visit to Thanjavur Peruvudaiyar Temple (Periya Kovil), evening arrive at Kumbakonam, check-in to the Hotel, Dinner and overnight stay at Kumbakonam

Ucchi Pillayar Temple, also known as the Arulmigu Tayumana Swamy Temple and Rockfort Temple, is a famous temple dedicated to Lord Ganesha in Tiruchirappalli, Tamil Nadu. According to legends, this rock is where King Ganesh fled from Vibhishana after establishing the deity Ranganathaswamy in Srirangam. According to epigraphic sources, the hill fort temple had built in the 6th century under the patronage of Mahendra Pallava-Gunaparan. Uchi Pillaiyar Temple locates at the top of Rock Fort Hill. The sanctuary is 273 feet high, and you have to climb 400 steps to reach the temple. You have to cross the Sri Tayumanavar Temple about halfway up. Although the climb is challenging, the gentle breeze refreshes our energy to climb without much pressure. The panoramic view of the entire Tiruchirappalli and Srirangam temple from the Uchi Vinayakar Temple is spectacular.

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Brihadeeshwara Temple (Peruvudaiyar Kovil) is a Hindu temple dedicated to Shiva located in Thanjavur in the Indian state of Tamil Nadu. It is also known as **Periya Kovil, RajaRajeswara Temple and Rajarajesvaram.** It is one of the largest temples in India and is an example of Dravidian architecture during the **Chola period**. Built by emperor **Raja Raja Chola** I and completed in **1010 AD**, the temple turned **1000 years old in 2010**. The temple is part of the **UNESCO** World Heritage Site known as the **"Great Living Chola Temples"**, with the other two being the **Brihadeeswarar Temple, Gangaikonda Cholapuram and Airavatesvara temple**.

The temple stands amidst fortified walls that were probably added in the 16th century. The vimanam (temple tower) is **216** *ft* (66 m) high and is the tallest in the world. The Kumbam (the apex or the bulbous structure on the top) of the temple is carved out of a single rock and weighs around **80 tons**. There is a big statue of Nandi (sacred bull), carved out of a single rock measuring about **16 ft (4.9 m) long and 13 ft (4.0 m)** high at the entrance. The entire temple structure is made out of granite, the nearest sources of which are about **60 km** to the west of temple. The temple is one of the most visited tourist attractions in Tamil Nadu.

17 JUL I MON: KUMBAKONAM

Breakfast at the Hotel; Kumbakonam is worldwide known as temple town, as many famous temples are located in and around the town. Some of the must visit temples of the town are mentioned below. Apart from the listed temples, if time permits you may also visit to Swamimalai Murugan temple (15 Km's & 45 Min's approx.), which is one of the 6 abodes of Lord Murugan, Dinner and overnight stay at the Hotel in Kumbakonam

Adi Kumbeswarar Temple

Adi Kumbeswarar temple is the oldest Shiva temple and the prime attraction in the town of Kumbakonam. Built by the Cholas in 7th Century, the city Kumbakonam derived its name due to the presence of this temple. This temple is famous for its conical shape Shiva Linga. Lord Shri Adi Kumbeswara and Goddess Mangalambigai are deities in the temple worshipped by the pilgrims who come here from all over the world.

Nageswarar Temple

Nageswarar temple is also one of the ancient Shiva temples in the town of Kumbakonam. This temple is the home of serpent gods. It was also built by the Chola dynasty during 12th century. This temple is known for its finest structure and architectural work. Lord Nageswarar Swamy and goddess Periyanayagi Amman are the main deities of the temple.

Kasi Vishwanthar Temple

Kasi Vishwanthar temple is located near Mahamahan Tank in Kumbakonam, where Mahamahan festival is organized in every 12 years. Goddess Vishalakshi Amman is the main deity of the temple along with the 9 presiding deities which are the famous 9 rivers such as Ganga, Yamuna, Narmada, Saraswati, Cauvery, Godavari, Tungabhadra, Krishna and Sarayu. Tourists are attracted by the South Indian style design and architecture of the temple. You can witness the huge crowd at the temple during the Mahamahan festival.

Sarangapani Temple

Sarangapani Temple is one of the famous Vishnu temples located near the town of Kumbakonam. It is located at the bank of Cauvery River and is one among the 108 Divya Deshams. It was renovated by the Nayaka dynasty in the 16th Century. Sarangapani Swamy and Komalavalli Thayar are the main deities of the temple who are served by the pilgrims.

18 JUL I TUE:

KUMBAKONAM - CHIDAMBARAM - PONDY

Breakfast at the Hotel; Morning check-out from the hotel and proceed to Pondy (140 Km's & 5.5 Hrs incl. stop at Chidambaram), en route visit to Chidambaram Thillai Natarajar Temple, evening arrive at Pondy, check-in to the Hotel; Dinner and overnight stay at Pondy.

The Nataraj Temple Chidambaram is also referred as Thillai Nataraj Temple. This temple is dedicated to Lord Shiva. It is in the southern state of Tamilnadu in India. The temple has a deep mythical connection. When the name of the town was Thillai, a Shiva shrine used to be there in the temple. Chidambaram is the name of the city where the temple is now situated literally meaning "clothed in thought" or "atmosphere of wisdom".

The architecture of the temple represents the link between arts and spirituality. The temple was constructed during the 10th Century when Chidambaram used to be the capital of the Chola dynasty. The Cholas considered Lord Shiva as Nataraj as their family deity. The Nataraj temple has undergone damage, renovation and expansion throughout the 2nd millennium. Although Shiva is the main deity of the temple, it also represents major themes from Vaishnavism, Shaktism and others

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with all due reverence. The Chidambaram temple complex proudly boasts of being one of the oldest temple complexes in Southern India. The most unique characteristic of the Nataraj Temple is the bejewelled image of Nataraj.

Pondicherry, A city of bon vivants - heritage, peace, delicious food and memories in store just for you, is synonymous with French architecture, tree-lined roads, and all that is reminiscent of the slow-paced past. The past here is intensely prevalent. From the war memorials such as the Foyer du Soldat commemorating Indian soldiers who participated in the Second World War to the most breathtaking churches such as the Notre Dame Des Anges, Pondicherry is a walk down the pages of history. Enjoy the heritage walks, take cycle tours or just a casual stroll on the streets; you will have several heritage buildings and establishments to see.

19 JUL I WED: PONDY - THIRUVANNAMALAI

Early morning visit to **Manakula Vinayagar temple**, Breakfast at the Hotel; morning check-out from the Hotel and proceed to visit **Auroville** and later proceed to Thiruvannamalai (120 km's & 3 Hrs), upon arrival, complete Hotel Check-in, evening visit to **Arunachaleshwara Temple**, Dinner at the Hotel and overnight stay at the Hotel in Thiruvannamalai

Manakula Vinayagar Temple, Nestled in the heart of the city, the temple is one of the famous ancient temples in Puducherry that offers holy and divine vibes to the devotees of Lord Ganesha. Widely renowned for its significance, heritage, and culture, this temple is dedicated to Hindu community and has everything you need to take some time off from the busy routine life. Dating its history back to at least 500 years ago, the Arulmigu Manakula Vinayagar Temple has 2 interesting tales attached to it. It is said that, during the French rule, the French people built a fort right beside the temple in the year 1688. To make an impact on their fort, they thought of removing the Vinayagar Temple from its current position and hence, started throwing the idol of Ganesha in the sea. But to their surprise, every time they did, the idol used to reappear on its own. Seeing this, the French people gave up and became the ardent follower of the Lord.

Auroville is a small town 6 km north of Pondicherry. This town was a vision of The Mother from Sri Aurobindo Ashram at Pondicherry as it's an international town. She envisioned a town where unity will be celebrated and all will have a spiritual vocation. The city was designed by architect Roger Anger. The township of Auroville is meant to be a universal town where men and women of all countries are able to live in peace and progressive harmony, above all creeds, all politics and all nationalities. Auroville was founded as a project of the Sri Aurobindo in 1968 by his disciple Mirra Alfassa, popularly called "The Mother". About 2,000 people from 50 countries live in this planned village.

Thiruvannamalai Arunachaleswarar Temple, Being one of the Pancha Bhoota Stalams [5 sacred temples] which represents the five basic elements of life viz. Earth, Fire, Water, Air and Sky, the Arunachaleswarar Temple is one of the most sacred Shaivite temple which represents the element Fire. Therefore Lord Shiva is worshipped here in the form of Agni Lingam [Agni- Fire]. As per the Shiva Purana [ancient Shiva epic], there are four most holy places where one can achieve liberation or salvation. Arunachaleswarar Temple at Tiruvannamalai is one among them. It is believed that even a mere thought of this temple liberates one from the cycle of rebirths. Such is the sanctity of this spiritual center.

20 JUL I THU:

21 JUL | FRI:

THIRUVANNAMALAI - KANCHIPURAM - CHENNAI

Breakfast at the Hotel; Morning check-out from the Hotel and proceed to Chennai (205 Km's & 6-7 Hrs incl. stop at Kanchipuram), en route visit to Kanchipuram Kamakshi Amman Temple and later proceed to Chennai, upon arrival at Chennai, check-in to the Hotel, Dinner and overnight stay at the Hotel in Chennai.

The Kamakshi Amman temple represents an important gem from the past. Set in the midst of Kanchipuram, also known as the City of Temples, this place of worship is home to the divine Goddess Kamakshi, who is believed to be an incarnation of Parvati, the Hindu goddess of love, fertility and strength. This temple has been around since times immemorial, going as far back as the 7th century. It was established under the auspice of the revered Indian guru Adi Shankaracharya, whose teachings are followed by the disciples of the Goddess till date. The Pallava kings who ruled the lands in that era probably built the temple, with the Chola and Vijaynagar kings later expanding by adding smaller shrines around the main temple. This sanctum of Kamakshi is one of the three important places of worship for the Goddess Shakti, the other two being Madura Meenakshi in Madurai and Kasi Visalakshi in Varanasi.

CHENNAI

Unforeseen escalation in fuel prices, COVID rules & regulations, new taxes/levies on hotels and transportation services or any hikes in entrance fees. Any large tax hikes and new levies shall be payable extra and shall be billed accordingly with reasonable prior notice

ATTIRE:

Visitors of both genders have to wear decent clothing to cover the body appropriately when visiting religious places and shorts and sleeveless tops are not acceptable. This rule is strictly adhered to at all religious sites

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
